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It's Time for RhoGAM®

You will be receiving your RhoGAM® injection at Morristown Medical Center.

To prepare for your RhoGAM® injection at Morristown Medical Center here are some things you must know:

- On the day of your RhoGAM® injection, you will have a blood test first and then an hour later you will get your RhoGAM® injection
- Morristown Medical Center administers RhoGAM® injections Monday through Friday between 8 AM and 3 PM
- You will need an appointment
- Your appointment time is for your injection, not your blood test time. The blood test is approximately 1 hour before your injection time.
- You do not need to wait at the hospital during the lag time between your blood test and RhoGAM® injection—but please return to the hospital for your injection at your appointment time
- You must bring your picture ID, your insurance card and the RhoGAM® prescription given to you by an Avalon midwife

Within 24 hours of receiving your RhoGAM® prescription from your Avalon midwife—please make these two phone calls to Morristown Medical Center:

- 973-971-5009 for your RhoGAM® injection appointment time
- 866-424-7734 Pre-registration

On the day of your RhoGAM® appointment:

- Remember to bring your picture ID, your insurance card and the RhoGAM® prescription given to you by your Avalon midwife.
- You may drive yourself to and from your appointment.
- You will report directly to Center for Digestive Health/Minor Procedure Department located on Franklin D in the hospital at least 1 hour and 15 minutes before your appointment time

Directions to Center for Digestive Health/Minor Procedure Department:

- Park in the visitors' lot on your right as you enter the hospital grounds from Madison Avenue
- Enter the front door of the hospital and proceed to the Franklin elevators
- Take the elevators to the "D" level
- Follow the signs to the CDH/Minor Procedure department

After you receive your RhoGAM® injection:

- Side effects to RhoGAM® are rare and extremely mild
- You may notice soreness, tenderness, warmth or develop a mild rash at the injection site
- Other mild side effects may include fever, chills, headache, or a feeling of fatigue
- If you experience other symptoms, please call your Avalon midwife
- The small amount of antibody in RhoGAM® has never been shown to harm the fetus. Millions of doses have been administered safely to Rh-negative mothers who have delivered healthy babies.
