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You will be receiving your RhoGAM® injection at Morristown Medical Center.

To prepare for your RhoGAM® injection at Morristown Medical Center here are some things you must

Prior to the injection you must have your blood drawn at the hospital lab. Please call the scheduling office in Labor and Delivery to schedule your injection, Rhogam injections are given in Labor and Delivery and appointments are scheduled on Tuesday, Wednesday and Fridays between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

You can have your blood drawn the same day as your injection if you prefer, however, please allow 2-3 hours turnaround time from the lab draw to the time of your scheduled appointment. Please let us know when you book your injection appointment when you will be going for your lab work.

The day of your lab work please go to Simon 1 Main lobby registration area, register and have your lab work drawn. you don't need an appointment for the lab work to be drawn but you will need to bring the prescription for the Rhogam from your provider. Please make sure there is an ICD 10 code on it.

The Labor and Deliver scheduling office is open Monday-Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. The phone number is 973-971-5032.

The lab is open Monday-Friday 6:30am to 6:45 pm. Saturday 7am to 2:45pm. Sundays closed. No appointment needed

On the day of your RhoGAM® appointment:

- Remember to bring your picture ID, your insurance card, and the RhoGAM® prescription given to you by your Avalon midwife.
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After you receive your RhoGAM® injection:

- Side effects to RhoGAM® are rare and extremely mild
- You may notice soreness, tenderness, warmth or develop a mild rash at the injection site.
- Other mild side effects may include: fever, chills, headache, or a feeling of fatigue
- If you experience other symptoms, please call your Avalon midwife.
- The small amount of antibody in RhoGAM® has never been shown to harm the fetus. Millions of doses have been administered safely to Rh-negative mothers who have delivered healthy babies. RhoGAM® does not contain preservatives.
